

ENACTED ARRESTEE DNA DATABASE LEGISLATION

As of September 2016

ALABAMA

House Bill 146
Enacted 2009

SPONSOR: Representative Ronald Johnson

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests. Increased the public safety fee to \$12 to pay for testing.

SENATE VOTE: 28-1

HOUSE VOTE: 98-1

ALASKA

House Bill 90
Enacted June 2007

SPONSOR: Representative Ralph Samuels

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for sex crimes and violent crimes and felony domestic abuse. Directs the crime lab to make “reasonable effort” to process the DNA samples within 90 days.

ARIZONA

House Bill 2787
Enacted May 2007

SPONSOR: Senator Chuck Gray*

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for homicide, manslaughter, murder, indecent exposure, public sexual indecency, sex abuse, sexual contact with a minor, sex assault, child molestation, bestiality, burglary, keeping or residing in a house of prostitution, prostitution, incest, soliciting abortion through a weapon. Increased the public safety fee from 3% on all civil and criminal fines to 7% to pay for testing.

*Omnibus crime package. Sen. Gray was not sponsor of enacted bill, but sponsored the original legislation.

ARKANSAS

House Bill 1473
Enacted 2009

SPONSOR: Representative Dawn Creekmore

Expands DNA database to include arrests for certain rapes and murders. Named “Juli’s Law”.

SENATE VOTE: 21-5

HOUSE VOTE: 87-7

House Bill XXX
Enacted 2015

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests.



CALIFORNIA

Proposition 69
Enacted November 2004

VOTERS INITIATIVE

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for murder and sex crimes. Automatically expands to include all felony arrests in 2009. Includes \$1 fee on every \$10 in criminal and civil violations to pay for DNA testing.

PASSED BY 62% OF POPULAR VOTE

COLORADO

SB 241
Enacted May 2009

SPONSOR: Senator John Morse
Representative Scott Tipton

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests – collected at booking, uploaded after charges. Public Safety Fee of \$2.50 to be charged on each conviction for all felonies, misdemeanors, misdemeanor traffic charges, and traffic infractions.

FLORIDA

SB 2276
Enacted June 2009

SPONSOR: Senator Steve Oelrich,
Representative William Snyder

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests, phased in.

ILLINOIS

HB 3238
Enacted June 2012

SPONSOR: Representative Susana Mendoza
Senator Kwame Raoul

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for first degree murder, home invasion, predatory criminal sexual assault of a child, aggravated criminal sexual assault, and sexual assault. Collection at indictment.

KANSAS

House Bill 2554
Enacted May 2006

SPONSOR: Representative Pat Colloton

Expands offender DNA database to include all violent felonies and some drug felonies in 2007. Automatically expands to include all felony arrests in 2009.

LOUISIANA

Senate Bill 346
Enacted June 2003

SPONSOR: Senator Jay Dardene

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrestees, as well as prostitution and soliciting prostitution.

MARYLAND

Senate Bill 211
Enacted May 2008

SPONSOR: At the request of the Governor

Expands DNA database to include to include a variety of certain felony arrests for sex crimes, violent crimes and burglary.

MICHIGAN

House Bill 4092
Enacted December 2008

SPONSOR: Representative Aldo Vagnozzi

Expands DNA database to include arrests for violent felonies.

Senate Bills 105-107
Enacted December 2014

SPONSOR: Senator Tanya Schuitmaker

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests.

Enacted May 2005

SPONSOR: Representative Erik Paulsen
Senator Leo Foley

Expands DNA database to include a variety of certain felony arrests for sex crimes, violent crimes and burglary.

*Enacted as part of the budget bill. Rep. Paulsen and Sen. Foley were not sponsors of enacted bill, but were sponsors of the original legislation.

Expands DNA database to include arrests for murder, sex assaults and burglary.

Expands DNA database to include all violent felony arrests and burglaries.

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests.

Enacted June 2011

SPONSOR: Senator Nicholas Sacco

Expands DNA database to include arrests for murder and sex assault.

NEW MEXICO

Senate Bill 216
Enacted February 2006

SPONSOR: Senator Mary Kay Papen

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for sex crimes, violent crimes, burglary, larceny, aggravated stalking, and kidnapping.

Senate Bill 365
Enacted April 2011

SPONSOR: Vernon Asbill

Expands existing arrestee DNA database law (passed in 2006) to include all felony arrests

House Bill 1403
Enacted April 2009

SPONSOR: Representative Will Neumann

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for violent crimes and burglary.

House Bill 1197
Enacted April 2007

SPONSOR: Representative Lawrence Klemin

Expands DNA database to include any adult arrested for a felony crime.

Enacted April 2010

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests.

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests.

Expands DNA database to include felony arrests for violent crimes and burglary.

Senate Bill 429
Enacted October 2008

SPONSOR: Senator Gerald Malloy

Expands DNA database to include any adult arrested for a felony crime, and for misdemeanor crimes of peeping, stalking and eavesdropping.

HOUSE VOTE: 86 - 25

SOUTH DAKOTA

Senate Bill 133
Enacted March 2008

SPONSOR: Senator Jay Duenwald

Expands DNA database to include any adult arrested for a felony crime.

SENATE VOTE: 34 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 66 - 3

TENNESSEE

Senate Bill 1196
Enacted May 2007

SPONSOR: Lt. Gov. John Ramsey

Requires DNA samples from any person arrested for a violent felony.

SENATE VOTE: 31 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 98 - 0

TEXAS

Senate Bill 638
Enacted June 2001

SPONSOR: Senator Gonzalo Barrientos

Expands DNA database to require samples from persons indicted for certain felonies including violent crimes, sex crimes and burglary, or on arrest for such crimes if there is a prior felony conviction.

UTAH

Senate Bill 277
Enacted March 2010

SPONSOR: Senator A.J. Adams

Expands DNA database to include arrests for violent crimes and burglary.

House Bill 212
Enacted April 2014

SPONSOR: Representative Steve Eliason

Expands DNA database to include all felony arrests

SENATE VOTE: 18-4

VIRGINIA

House Bill 892
Enacted April 2002

SPONSOR: Representative Ryan McDougle

Requires DNA samples from persons arrested for certain felonies including sex crimes, violent crimes and burglary.

SENATE VOTE: 39 - 0

HOUSE VOTE: 93-4

WISCONSIN

Assembly Bill 40
Enacted 2013

SPONSOR:

Expands DNA database to include violent felonies and burglary.
